As part of the Western Sydney Supply Project, TransGrid will build a new 132/220 kV substation at Rookwood Road, Potts Hill. The new substation is critical in supplying electricity to EnergyAustralia who then distribute to homes and businesses. The substation will be purpose built and contain state of the art equipment and transformers. The substation will be built to the highest environmental standards.

A Review of Environmental Factors

A Review of Environmental Factors (REF) has been prepared to assess the potential environmental impacts of the project. The review covers land use, noise, hours of work, traffic and access, flood levels, flora and fauna, cultural heritage, visual amenity and landscape, geology and soils, and electric and magnetic fields.
