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Substation supersized by project

Western NSW will be home to one of the biggest and most sophisticated substations in the Southern Hemisphere as part of the \$1.8 billion EnergyConnect project. Crews have been working hard building the 'bench' for the 16-hectare substation at Buronga, which will be the main hub to connect NSW, Victoria and South Australia. Testing time for transformers

EnergyConnect has passed another milestone with the start of testing on new substation transformers. A team from Transgrid and our construction partner SecureEnergy has just returned from South Korea where contractor Hyosung is building five Phase Shifting Transformers for the project. The first transformer will arrive mid-2023 at the expanded Buronga Substation.





Towers take shape on site

Our construction partner SecureEnergy and subcontractor Catalpa Group have started assembling the transmission towers for EnergyConnect. These are the first of 291 towers which will be installed on the alignment from Buronga to the South Australian border. The guyed towers, which are up to 57 metres in height and weigh up to 16 tonnes, require 15 per cent less steel and 25 per cent less concrete than conventional tower designs.

Firm foundations for works

SecureEnergy and their contractors are powering ahead with tower footings for EnergyConnect. Thousands of concrete foundation stubs are required to be poured to support more than 1500 towers being constructed along the project alignment from Wagga Wagga to the South Australian border.
