# Acknowledgement of Country

In the spirit of reconciliation Transgrid acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the various lands on which this project is planned and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people participating in this project.

## Overview

Transgrid operates and manages the high voltage electricity transmission network in NSW and the ACT, connecting generators, distributors, and major end users.

Over decades of technical excellence, we have enabled the smooth operation of 13,085km of high voltage transmission wires and 128 substations.

Our network is the backbone of the National Energy Market, enabling energy trading between Australia's three largest states along the east coast, and supporting the competitive wholesale electricity market, while leading the transition to a clean energy future.

We know that we have an important role to play in creating a more equitable future. In March 2023, we launched our Stretch Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP), which is the third stage of RAP under the Reconciliation Australia framework.

Our Stretch RAP comprises a wide range of initiatives and programs over the next three years as well as the steps we will take to achieve them. It will capitalise on the progress we made in delivering our second Innovate RAP in 2020.

In May 2020, we published our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Engagement and Participation Policy, which affirms Transgrid's commitment to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and communities during the development, delivery, maintenance and operation of our projects and assets.

## Our commitment

Our Stretch RAP is set upon six core areas of focus, through which we are committed to:

- 1 Furthering respectful and meaningful relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities across our transmission network.
- 2 Deepening the cultural awareness, understanding and respect of our employees and leaders.
- 3 Showing deep respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artefacts and places impacted by our projects.
- 4 Delivering measurable and sustainable economic benefits to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander businesses and communities that we work with.
- 5 Improving employment opportunities, retention, and professional development of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples within Transgrid.
- 6 Leading and championing reconciliation within the energy industry.



## Project outline

Transgrid is seeking expressions of interest from individuals, organisations, or cultural educators to deliver interactive workshop style education sessions at Transgrid Discovery Hub – 27 Kincaid Street, Wagga Wagga NSW 2650. These workshops aim to enhance awareness, understanding, and respect for Wiradjuri culture, history, and tradition with school students.

## Workshop Objectives

Transgrid Discovery Hub will host an education workshop for students across the region in collaboration with the Social Legacy team. This workshop aims to celebrate and strengthen our ongoing commitment to the values outlined in our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). By focusing on Wiradjuri culture and language, we aim to provide an engaging learning experience that deepens cultural understanding and respect while meeting key curriculum outcomes. The workshop will offer a range of engaging activities, providing students with a holistic experience that not only connects them with Wiradjuri language but also its traditions and stories, fostering a sense of pride and responsibility in preserving and revitalising the culture for future generations.

## Activities of interest

We welcome EOIs for workshops in areas such as:

- > Traditional knowledge and storytelling
- > Indigenous languages
- > Cultural practices, arts, and crafts
- > History and truth-telling
- > Connection to Country and environmental stewardship

- > Sports or activities

## How sessions will work

- > Each workshop will run for 16 minutes and then students will rotate to the next workshop.
- > A Transgrid, or delivery partner staff member will be with your group to assist you.
- > School groups will be limited to 60 and broken down into workshop groups of 10-15 students.

## Eligibility and Requirements

Interested applicants should meet the following criteria:

- > NSW Working with Children Check – This must be supplied to be eligible for selection.
- > Demonstrated knowledge in Indigenous education and cultural teachings.
- > Be a member of Supply Nation, NSW Indigenous Chamber of Commerce
- > Ability to deliver engaging, interactive, and age-appropriate content.
- > Effective communication and facilitation skills.
- > Connection to and endorsement from an Indigenous community or Elder/s.
- > Experience working with diverse audiences.
- > Commitment to attend either all the primary sessions, all the secondary sessions, or all sessions for both primary and secondary excursions.
- > Suppliers must either have an ABN and be able to invoice Transgrid for payment, alternatively be able to supply an invoice and receive payment via card payment.
- > All workshops will be paid at an all-inclusive rate of \$150 per hour. This is not subject to negotiation and does not include time travelled, preparation, accommodation, or any additional costs to the supplier including staff.
- > Payment will be made 14 days after receipt of an invoice or the event.
- > Successful applicants will need to be available to attend an induction session on 21 July 2025 and be available to run through workshops.
