

EnergyConnect

EnergyConnect is an energy infrastructure project that will lower power bills for homes and businesses and create 1,500 jobs, primarily across regional NSW.

The Australian energy landscape is transforming, with an increased focus on renewable energy sources. To connect Australian communities and businessesto these new energy sources, the national electricity grid needs to evolve.

EnergyConnect will deliver the infrastructure to support this evolution by connecting the energy grids of NSW, SA and Victoria with a new 900 km electricity transmission line, known as an interconnector.

The proposed interconnector would run between Wagga Wagga in NSW and Robertstown in SA, with a connection to Red Cliffs in VIC.

Land access

We may require access to private land to conduct studies on the proposed route corridor.

These studies may include environmental, geotechnical and cultural heritage surveys.

What to expect

If access to private land is required, a Transgrid representative will contact you to explain why we need property access.

We will provide a land access consent form, which will include:

- the type of activities proposed to be conducted and proposed locations
- timeframes for the activities to be completed
- conditions required to access the site
- any remediation to be undertaken once activities are completed.

Transgrid representatives will not conduct any activities on private land without prior consent.

What types of activities are proposed?

We need to conduct a range of preliminary activities including surveys, assessments and other investigations. These activities are generally non-invasive and are used to inform the design and planning approval of EnergyConnect. Examples of the preliminary activities include:

- environmental and ecological surveys
- geotechnical investigations
- cultural heritage surveys.

More detailed information about the specific activities proposed on your land will be discussed with your cultural heritage expert and a Transgrid supervisor.

How will we work together?
