### Land access

#### Project EnergyConnect

The Australian energy landscape is transforming with an increased focus on renewable energy sources. To connect Australian communities and businesses to these new energy sources the national electricity grid needs to evolve.

Part of this evolution is the construction of a transmission line, known as an interconnector, connecting New South Wales, South Australia and Victoria.

The proposed interconnector would be around 900km long and run between Wagga Wagga in NSW and Robertstown in SA, with a connection to Red Cliffs in VIC.

#### Land access

Project EnergyConnect is in its early stages and TransGrid is conducting preliminary field studies that will help identify a preferred route corridor.

Access to private land may be required to conduct these studies, which include environmental, geotechnical and cultural heritage surveys.

#### What to expect?

If access to private land is required, a TransGrid representative will contact you to introduce the project and why property access is needed.

A land access consent form will be provided, which will include:

- The type of activities proposed to be conducted and proposed locations
- Timeframes for the activities to be completed
- Conditions required to access the site
- Any remediation to be undertaken once activities are completed.

TransGrid representatives will not conduct any activities on private land unless prior consent has been received.

## What are the types of activities proposed?

TransGrid needs to conduct a range of preliminary activities including surveys, assessments and other investigations. These activities are generally non-invasive and will be used to inform the design and planning approval of Project EnergyConnect. Examples of the preliminary activities include:

- Environmental and ecological surveys
- Geotechnical investigations
- Cultural heritage surveys.

More detailed information about the specific activities proposed on your land will be discussed with you.
